

A traditional event which usually takes place during our annual year-end June dinner meeting is the presentation of scholarships to deserving and qualifying students who have demonstrated scholastic excellence in the study and promotion of environmental health and safety/industrial hygiene at the collegiate undergraduate or graduate levels. And, for the past five years, our scholarship program has been open to high school senior year level students with some experience in a STEM (science, technology, engineering, mathematics)-oriented educational curriculum, and who have expressed an interest in pursuing a STEM-based curriculum, or preferably an IH/occupational and environmental health and safety (OEHS)-based curriculum at the collegiate level.

Though we did not have any high school level scholarship applicants this year, the NJAIHA Executive Committee was very pleased to be able to approve the awarding of scholarships to four deserving college students to the total of \$7,000!




